New in 2014, as a part of your medical benefits, all children up to the age of 19 are eligible for dental care benefits.

Regular dental care is essential for children to ensure that they are ready to learn in school. Every year children miss millions of hours from school due to dental issues - persisting pain and inability to sleep.

Children should see the dentist from the first year of life, with check-ups and cleanings every six months.

Dental services and benefits include the following

Oral exams (2 in 12 months)

NOTE: An exam by a dentist is recommended by age 1. An exam by a dentist is required by age 3, and then recommended every 6 months.

- X-rays
 - Bitewing X-rays (1 in 12 months)
 - Full mouth or panoramic X-rays (1 in 5 years)
 - Other X-rays as needed
- Teeth cleaning (3 in 12 months)
- Fluoride treatment (2 in 12 months to age 19)
- Sealant (1st and 2nd permanent molars under age 14, 1 per tooth per 3 years)
- Space maintainers (1 per space under age 14)
- Filling of cavities (white fillings are only covered on front teeth)
- Crowns, caps, and onlays (1 per tooth in 5 years)
- Bridges (permanent, 1 in 5 years)
- Sedative filling
- Crown buildup, including pins
- Root canals and other endodontic services
- Extractions, simple and surgical
- Limited other oral surgery
- Emergency treatment of dental pain
- I.V. sedation (when medically necessary)
- Complete denture (1 in 5 years)
- Partial denture (1 in 5 years)
- Denture adjustments and repairs
- Denture rebase and reline (1 time in 3 years)
- Temporary partial denture (only to replace front teeth)
- Re-cement crowns, bridges, space maintainers
- Restorative veneers (between ages 8 through 19, 1 per 36 months on the 8 front teeth if damaged by certain conditions)
- Treatment of gum disease (non-surgical and limited surgical procedures)
